A key milestone we are incredibly proud to share is the recent purchase of 44 acres in Quakertown, a perfect location for our future permanent home.

Remi's TALE

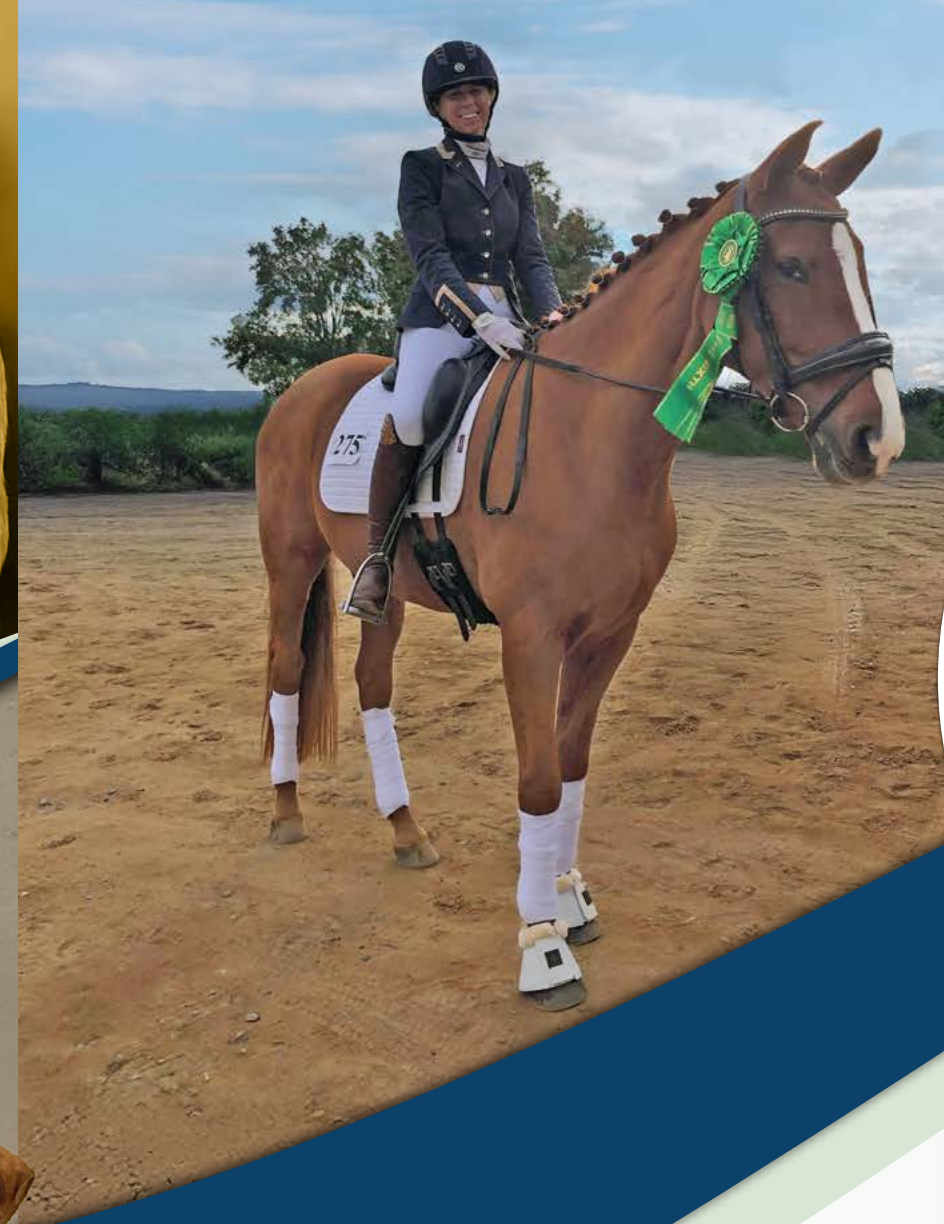
Remi, a golden retriever puppy, was surrendered to LCR with her brother, but shortly after arriving, she began vomiting and refusing food. **An emergency vet discovered five baby pacifiers obstructing her intestines, nearly causing rupture.** Fortunately, she underwent a challenging surgery and made a full recovery, and soon after, her health was restored.

Now, Remi is thriving in her adoptive home, where she's become a beloved member of the family.

Her two older brothers, Joe and Jack, have welcomed her warmly. Joe, a rescued pointer mix, was initially shy and frightened, but since Remi's arrival, he's become playful and energetic. Together, Remi and Joe make a dynamic duo, with their older brother Jack playing the role of "sheriff" as they romp and play.



Clarissa's TALE



Clarissa was rescued in January 2016, and her journey to recovery is nothing short of miraculous. She, along with several other horses, had endured months—if not years—of neglect before finding her way to LCR. When Clarissa arrived, she was estimated to be over three hundred pounds underweight and so weak that she could not stand on her own. For days, the dedicated LCR team worked tirelessly around the clock, lifting her when she couldn't get up. With the help of an Anderson Sling, we were able to support her until she could gradually begin to support herself again.

After many long months of careful rehabilitation, with proper nutrition and a loving, patient team by her side, Clarissa began to flourish. **Today, she proudly shows off the incredible progress she's made, showcasing the achievements of a true rescue in the show ring.** It's a testament to the strength of this beautiful horse and the unwavering dedication of everyone who believed in her recovery.

URGENCY OF NEED:

Current Challenges

INSUFFICIENT BARN FACILITIES:

We have limited barn stalls in a small barn, forcing staff to make difficult decisions every day to determine which animals need a stall for their needs.

A CHALLENGING WORKING ENVIRONMENT:

Our current space limits the effectiveness of our volunteers and staff, making it harder for them to care for **MORE THAN 150 ANIMALS ON A DAILY BASIS.**

LIMITED INDIVIDUAL CARE SPACES:

The lack of individual spaces hinders our ability to provide the specialized care they so desperately need.

LIMITED DEDICATED SPACES:

With limited spaces for small animals, cats, and barnyard animals, our current setup simply isn't equipped to give them the environment they deserve.

GROWING COMMUNITY NEEDS:

The community we serve relies on us to care for the animals they love, but our current facility cannot meet the growing demand. Without the proper space and resources, we are unable to help all those in need.

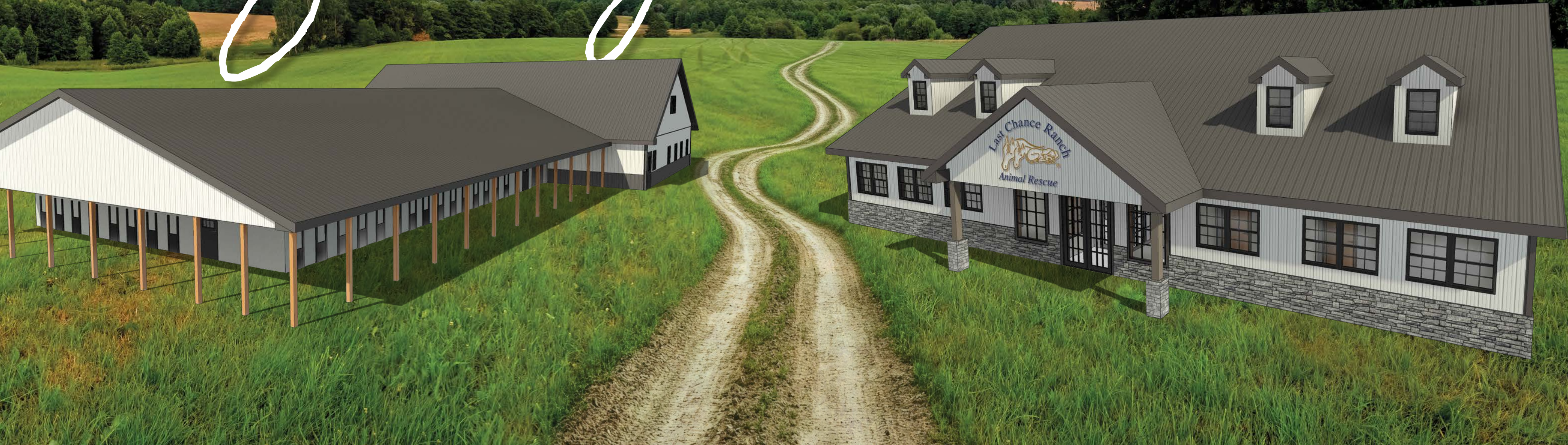
Crossroads...

Highlights OF OUR NEW FACILITIES

Animal-Centered Environment for Comfort and Well-Being

- Modern design to reduce stress and meet growing needs
- Fear-free color palette to create a calming setting for cats and dogs
- Fiber-reinforced polymer (FRP) kennels and walls for easy cleaning and sanitation
- Two free-roaming cat rooms to improve adoption visibility
- Four dog play yards for exercise and enrichment
- Walking trails for dogs and equines to provide environmental stimulation and promote training



Enhanced Medical and Rehabilitation Facilities

- Increased number of individual care spaces
- Specialized isolation treatment areas
- Heartworm suite for quiet, focused treatment
- Recovery barn equipped with an Anderson Sling and a warm isolation stall
- Spacious indoor and outdoor riding arenas

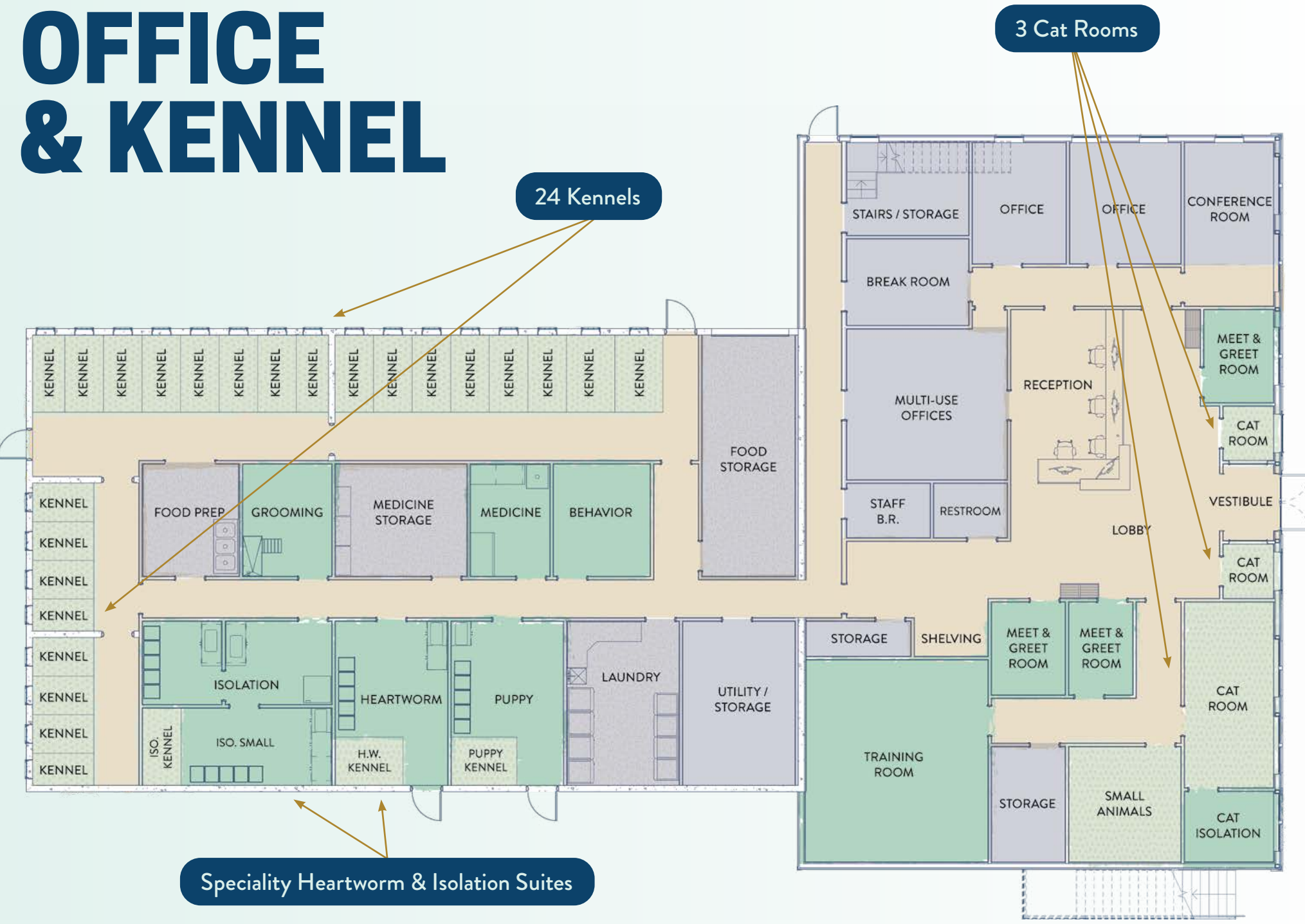
Innovative Infrastructure for Efficiency and Safety

- Centrally located food prep, medical intake, behavioral evaluation, and laundry rooms
- Two multi-purpose rooms for education, training, and events
- Ample storage space for feed within the barn
- Separate equipment storage barn for fire safety
- Expansive sheds with attached stone lots and pastures to safely maintain groups of horses
- Six paddocks for small barnyard animals and multiple pastures for grazing



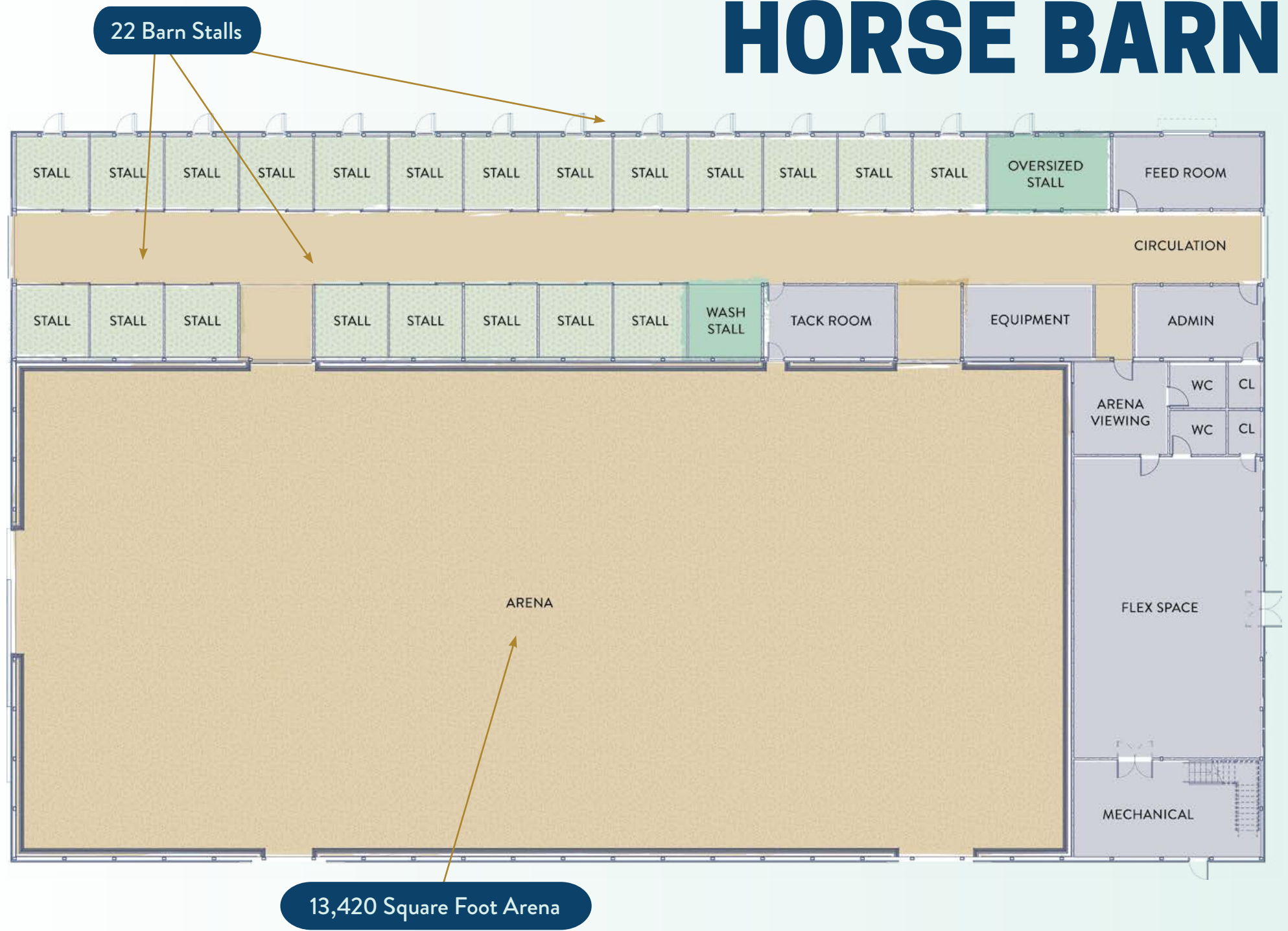
PROPOSED FLOOR PLAN
